will provide fund for the construction of at least one pre-school building with two classrooms throughout the country where Aboitiz company operates. AFI aims to put up 45 school buildings – 26 this year and 19 more for next year.

In fact, a Memorandum Of Agreement (MOA) was sealed on June 10 between CLPC's VP & Resident Manager Crisente Ferolino and DepEd's XII Superintendent Dr. Melinda Maruhom, together with Cotabato City Central Pilot Elementary School (CCCPS) Principal Mr. Wahabi Guiani and CLPC HR/Comrel Officer Anna Lea Lee Nataño for the implementation of this project.
